### "THE STOLEN JOY WILL RETURN"

Amid the turmoil and threats of persecution, SAT-7 is helping Syrian Christians take comfort in Jesus. The encouraging words of women from war-torn Aleppo, broadcast on SAT-7 ARABIC, helped show viewers, in similar situations, that God is with them.

At a church event broadcast by SAT-7, church member Mona described the perils faced by countless Christians and the incredible faith of one believer, even when he was faced with death.

"A young man named Abdel used to attend services here. He was a quiet man but always praying," Mona said. "Abdel was a doctor who offered much-needed medical services for free after war broke out. Soon enough," Mona continued, "Daesh (IS) militants came to the city and captured him. They threatened to kill Abdel unless he denounced his faith, but he refused and was executed."

Despite the threats they face, Christians in Syria are turning to God and able to see His blessings. Another church attendee, Therese, described how God's grace spared her and her family. Therese said: "Walking along the street after visiting our relatives, we heard a terrifyingly loud explosion. We are no better than those who were killed, but because we still have a role here to witness to the goodness of our Lord, He is good and protects us. Each one of us has a role among her family, her friends, her neighbours, to witness to the Lord, His goodness and His eternal mercy."

Well-known speaker Dr Yvette Elbayadi Isaac also encouraged the congregation and SAT-7's viewers, saying: "People around the world are praying for the Church in Syria. [We believe] all that was stolen from us will be returned, the stolen joy and security will return."

- Plead for reduced violence in the Middle East. Intercede for those displaced, injured, and suffering.
- Praise God for faithful church leaders who are remaining in dangerous areas to serve their struggling congregation and to mentor those who want to know God more. Pray for believers in dangerous areas. Ask that they may keep the Christian faith alive.

### **MODERN-DAY HEROES OF FAITH IN IRAN**

"They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated – the world was not worthy of them." (Hebrews 11:37-38)

Right now, we have Christian brothers and sisters across the Middle East and North Africa living in the face of violent oppression. Iranian Christians in particular face different kinds of subversive persecution that has put a tight squeeze on their livelihoods.

Mansour Khajehpour, former Executive Director of SAT-7 PARS, came to Christ from a devout Shia background at the age of 15. He says, "If you accept Jesus Christ in Iran, you keep this between you and your wife or husband. Around you, there are spies who will betray you, so it has to stay in your heart. People constantly lose their jobs, are disowned by their communities and family members, are kicked out of schools and workplaces, and are beaten on the streets. I have the joy and honour of saying I personally experienced most of those."

Viewers contact SAT-7 counsellors to ask for prayer, encouragement and fellowship during isolating times. They face trials that would be uncommon in the Western world, but they are courageous heroes.

Sam contacts SAT-7 to say, "Thank you for your kindness and for supporting me with the Word of Truth. I didn't expect people to react so aggressively when I told them about the Bible. I had no peace when it first happened. But today I'm at peace and have no fear because I truly feel that God is with me. I always pray, and I believe in the power of prayer. To pray in the name of Jesus Christ is mighty."

- Pray for God's protection for the believers of home groups that are considered illegal in their country.
- Several church leaders in Iran have recently been sentenced to long terms in prison. Pray for their courage, protection, peace of mind, and release.
- Ask God to use SAT-7 powerfully to provide fellowship, teaching, and inspiration for believers who have no one with whom to share their faith or to encourage them in person.

I'm upset with myself: being distant from a community has this fading effect on my faith. Sometimes I don't even open the Bible. There was a time that I wouldn't go to bed before reading the Word. Being far from the community of believers is difficult. I ask our Lord Jesus Christ to have mercy on me, Iran, and Iranians, and that we may once again worship our living Saviour in perfect unity, with one voice."
